# Meet Your Neighbors Jenna and Seth Maze

Jenna and Seth Maze are not only among the younger and newer Diamond A residents, they are also unusual because they are educating their four wonderful 4 to 12 year old children mostly by home schooling. Home schooling is an educational process which may be



unfamiliar to some who read this. They are also doing a pretty heavy makeover of their 3-acre property on White Oak Court, taking out overgrown trees and putting in some amazing organic vegetables and raising chickens. Jenna was born in Crescent City, and the family moved around Northern Californian and Oregon a bit before she returned to Crescent City to finish high school and seek a degree in cosmetology. Seth spent most of his early years in San Francisco and grew up in Sonoma. He enjoyed his education at CSU-Chico and graduated with a degree in construction management. They met through Seth's mother who introduced them when she was in the stands at a Chico sporting event; they married (16 years ago) when they were relatively young. Jenna started and grew a cosmetology business which she sold to concentrate on their kids and Seth, after working for others in the construction field, decided that he, too, wanted to be his own boss.

After getting married in Sonoma, they started out in Sonoma County and fell in love with the town early on. Except for a short time during Covid when they were living in Montana, they've lived in the Sonoma area and, after they found the right site, Diamond A in particular.

Their initial experience with public and private schools was unsatisfactory. They found the education process inefficient and ineffective. They also had relatives elsewhere who had enjoyed terrific experiences with home schooling, both as students themselves and later as parents, and, after looking into it, they decided to give it a try. They also thought that they had been missing out on the best parts of being parents. Their four kids [ed. note: obviously very bright and well-mannered] have a school day which probably averages 4-5 hours a day, but without the noneducational "stuff" that fills a public school day. Jenna is confident that the kids are progressing well above what would be grade level in their education. [This reminds me of Garrison Keillor's line that in Lake Wobegon, all of the kids are above average...but these kids really are.] In the early years, she's comfortable that she stays ahead of the kids, but she knows that the skills of others will increasingly become necessary. Currently, for the older kids she subs out robotics and math to a professor in Santa Rosa, and Seth helps with computer stuff; she looks forward to drawing on other resources as necessary. Currently they are studying the Middle Ages in an interdisciplinary way, which on a given day may include writing, reading, music, science and art. During other parts of the day they all have chores, whether in the garden or with the animals, learning responsibility and

biology and animal husbandry along the line. The Mazes and other Sonoma home schoolers gather regularly as a community to exchange ideas and resources for things like the performing arts and second languages.
