John and Judith Walsh

Right here in Diamond A, our John Walsh is married to our Judith Walsh; that's not the amazing part. Believe it or not, folks, John's former wife

was named Judith Walsh, and Judith's former husband was named John Walsh. Now, *that's* amazing.

As many of you know, John has invested hundreds of hours in his role as President of the Diamond A Neighborhood Association, dealing extensively and intensively with, among other things, the short term rental issue while suffering threats of litigation; Judith puts in countless hours working with multiple Sonoma non-profits in various roles while also helping to make Diamond A the welcoming community it is, including (among other roles) as the cochair of the committee that puts on the Hill Warming and other events. Judith is a "California girl," born and raised in the Napa area and a graduate of UC Berkeley and Boalt Hall, the UC Berkeley law school. She remembers her first job, making props for her kindergarten teacher-mother to use at school and working at the Napa library while still in high school. However, most of her working life was spent as a lawyer in the Tax Planning group at Chevron, covering all aspects of that company's operations. Her non-profit activities include being on the Boards of Impact 100 Sonoma and Sonoma Overnight Support and actively modernizing the rental assistance records at FISH (Friends in Sonoma Helping).

John and Judith married in 2005 after a non-whirlwind 26 year courtship. They'd first met in 1979 at a birthday party that Judith threw for herself, and a friend had brought John along. The relationship was long distance twice as John was moved around the country while working for IBM and then AT&T. But John moved back to the Bay Area for good in 1987. They maintained dual households (but with visiting privileges) until 2008. John jokes that he didn't want to rush into anything.

They found a spectacular Diamond A parcel on Viewcrest in 2007 but for various reasons did not get their thoughtfully elder-safe house completed until 2011, as which point they became Diamond A residents.
