# REC IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS STATUS

You may have noticed some activity at The Rec the past few days – the clubhouse is being painted inside and out! Leading the charge on this project is Mark Pierce, who has designed a natural color palette in keeping with the regulations of Sonoma County. The main color for the outside is a leafy green, with trim in taupe and roof areas in a warm brown. The restroom doors and front door of The Rec will be painted a dark brown. The inside walls of the clubhouse will be painted a shade of light beige with a little darker trim. Since a more complete re-do of the inside of the clubhouse is not in the cards in the immediate future, we thought a new coat of paint would help spruce it up for now. A big thank you to Mark Pierce for all his efforts on behalf of The Rec!

The biggest pending project is the resurfacing of the inside of the pool. Mark Hannon has worked hard these last few months identifying a vendor, organizing all the specifics involved, and submitting the proper documentation to the County for a permit. The work had been scheduled to start the week of March 16, but unfortunately the PRMD closed its doors as part of the shutdown, and our permit was not able to be issued in time. As soon as we get our permit, we will get the crew back in to start the project. It will take about two weeks from start to finish. We are optimistically hoping to have this completed before the Pool Opening Party scheduled for May 30.

Other things that are in progress: New tables and chairs to replace the old picnic tables, a new portable BBQ, and window shades for the new sliding glass doors and the other windows in the clubhouse.

We are also planning to install a ramp from the parking lot to the clubhouse, to make it easier for those who have difficulty with stairs or are disabled to make their entrance. Mark Pierce has drawn up plans, and Mark Hannon is arranging for the work to be done.

What a lovely facility we will have once all the above are completed!

## **BOARD PERSONNEL CHANGE**

Regrettably, Cameron Morris has resigned his position as Board Treasurer, due to his business and personal obligations. Cameron was highly instrumental in helping us to implement our new accounting/communications software, as well as the transition to an improved dues billing process. We owe him a lot of thanks for his efforts.

Dave Duncan has agreed to take over the Treasurer's role for the rest of Cameron's term. Evie Duncan will handle the day-to-day banking and bill-paying tasks.

## **DUES**

Yes, it's that time again. Our membership year runs from June 1 – May 31, so in late April we will be starting the process of sending out renewal communications and dues invoices. For regular members, there will be no increase in dues. The full regular rate will remain at \$750. For those who took advantage of last year's opt-out option, this year you will see a modest increase to the next level of the five-year tiered rate increases set out last year (see chart below).

This means that for 2020, those who opted-out as non-seniors will pay 91% of the full rate, or \$682.50 and those who opted-out as seniors will pay 64% of the full rate or \$480.

Although we've had to curtail a few activities in the short term, we have numerous fun events planned going forward. And of course, there are still our tennis/pickleball, walking path/track, kids playground, horse arena and pool for your recreational pleasure. Your dues help to maintain all these facilities and are funding the many improvements already noted as well as others which are scheduled for coming years. We thank you for your continuing support!

#### **OUR MIGHTY OAK**

A HUGE thank you to Robert and Kate Bartlett who offered to subsidize the recent tree work on our large oak tree at the entrance to The Rec. It was felt that the tree was looking a little "worn" and could use some trimming and shoring up; however, the cost was prohibitive and not in our budget at this time. The Bartletts stepped up to offer the services of their company, Bartlett Tree Experts. Last month the work was done – significant pruning as well as some cabling of heavier limbs.
